



In Conroe ISD, we encourage all students to read over the summer in order to enrich learning and provoke thought. Summer reading strengthens reading skills, increases academic achievement, fosters a love for reading, and empowers students to become life-long learners. Additionally, students who enroll in advanced English courses are expected to engage in summer reading as it provides preparation for the upcoming school year and creates a common framework for classroom discussion and instruction.

DC English IV 2332 and 2333 Summer Reading

DC English IV 2332 and 2333 focus on World Literature, encompassing the writings of the ancient world to the present day. All reading and exploration completed over the summer will help students form foundations of understanding for the work completed during the first semester. These works will help students form a context of the culture and character respected and abhorred in those civilizations. Choices do not have to focus on ancient Western civilizations, but may include works about any ancient civilization.

This summer English IV Dual Credit Students will read the literary classic *Homer's Odyssey*

We will use this work as a foundational piece for our first and second units. We will also use this piece to establish requisite skills for 2332 and 2333.

Homer's *Odyssey* exemplifies the Western idea of epic. We will use this to compare works of other cultures and civilizations.

The *Odyssey* shares Odysseus's twenty year journey home from the Trojan War. Homer divided this epic into books instead of chapters. Consider each book a new adventure. Look for the values and expected consequences found within Greek culture demonstrated throughout the work.
